Installation Instructions

Minimum Tool and Equipment List

The following tools are required to remove and install the instrument covers and panels. All tools are standard tools that should be readily available.

Item	Name	Description
1	Screwdriver handle (magnetic)	Torque driver. Accepts 1/4 inch hex-head driver tips
2	No. 2 Phillips or Pozidriv tip	Phillips or Pozidriv-driver tip for number 2 size screw heads

These instructions are for qualified service personnel who are familiar with servicing the product. If you need further details for disassembling or reassembling the product, refer to the RSA3303B & RSA3308B 3 GHz & 8 GHz Real-Time Spectrum Analyzers Service Manual, Tektronix part number 071-2367-XX or the RSA3408B 8 GHz Real-Time Spectrum Analyzer Service Manual, Tektronix part number 071-2366-XX.

NOTE. If you are installing this kit in an RSA3408B with the optional removable hard drive, refer to the service manual for diagrams and instructions that may help with the installation of this kit.

Remove External Modules

NOTE. Right-side or left-side references in these instructions assume you are viewing the instrument from the rear panel.



WARNING. To avoid electric shock, switch off the instrument power, then disconnect the power cord from the mains power. Failure to do so can cause injury or death.

Line Cord

- 1. *Orient the analyzer:* Set the analyzer so its bottom is down on the work surface and its rear is facing you.
- **2.** Remove the line cord: Remove the line cord from the rear cover.

Cabinet

- 1. Assemble equipment: Obtain a #2 Phillips screwdriver.
- **2.** *Remove the cabinet:*
 - **a.** Remove the screw securing each rear foot to the rear panel at each corner.
 - **b.** Remove the center two screws securing the cabinet to the rear panel.
 - **c.** Slide the cabinet backward. As you remove the cabinet, take care not to bind or snag it on the analyzer's internal cabling.




Figure 1: Line cord and cabinet removal

Remove CPU Assembly

- 1. Assemble equipment and locate module to be removed:
 - **a.** You will need a #2 Phillips screwdriver.
 - **b.** Locate the CPU board (closest to the front of the instrument).
- **2.** *Orient the analyzer:* Set the analyzer so its bottom is down on the work surface and its front is facing you.

3. Remove the brackets:

- **a.** Remove the two screws securing the board stopper bracket to the memory support bracket. Lift the bracket away.
 - Retain the two screws but discard the board stopper bracket.
- b. Remove the two screw securing the memory support bracket to the disk bracket. Lift the bracket away.Retain the two screws but discard the memory support bracket.




Figure 2: CPU assembly removal

4. Remove the CPU board:

- **a.** Remove the two jack screws next to the VGA connector. Retain the jack screws for reinstallation.
- **b.** Unplug the cables from the connector FDD1, COM1, IDE1, USB, CN2, and CN3 on the CPU board.

- **c.** Unplug the cable from the connector J102 on the A63 DVO converter attached to the CPU board.
- **d.** Remove the two screw securing the board to the main chassis. Lift the board up away.

Retain the two screws for reinstallation.

Install New CPU Assembly

1. Install the new CPU assembly into the instrument. Reinstall the two screws that secure the CPU assembly. Tighten the screws to 5.5 inch-lbs.

NOTE. The new CPU assembly consists of the CPU board with it's bracket (407-4989-XX) and Gasket (348-A117-XX) installed.

- 2. Reinstall the two jack screws next to the VGA connector.
- **3.** Install the 407-4987-03 memory support bracket:
 - **a.** Install the two screws (previously removed) that secure the memory support bracket to the disk bracket. Do not tighten the screws yet.




Figure 3: Installing the support memory bracket

b. Slide the memory support bracket against the SIMM cards on the CPU assembly, then tighten the screws. (See Figure 4.)

4. Mount the CPU stopper bracket on top of the CPU assembly card. Start with the CPU stopper bracket to the right of the memory support bracket. Ensure that the slot in the spacer post fits over the top edge of the CPU card assembly. (See Figure 5.)

5. Flex the CPU board slightly and push the CPU Stopper bracket down. Ensure the cutouts in the bracket slide into place against the chassis.




Figure 6: Aligning the CPU stopper bracket

6. Slide the CPU stopper bracket into place. (See Figure 6.)

- 7. Secure the CPU Stopper bracket with the two screws previously removed.
- **8.** Reinstall the FDD1, COM1, IDE1, USB, CN2, and CN3 cables on the CPU board

Reinstall External Modules

Cabinet

- **1.** Reinstall the cabinet:
 - **a.** Slide the cabinet forward over the chassis. Take care not to bind or snag the cabinet on the analyzer's internal cabling.
 - **b.** Reinstall the center two screws securing the cabinet to the rear panel.
 - **c.** Reinstall the rear feet on the rear panel at each corner.

Line Cord

1. Reinstall the line cord.

This completes the installation of the 119-7548-XX CPU Card Assembly Replacement.
