As a further step to improve coordination of the Tektronix operation, Howard Vollum has appointed Mike to the Management Group.

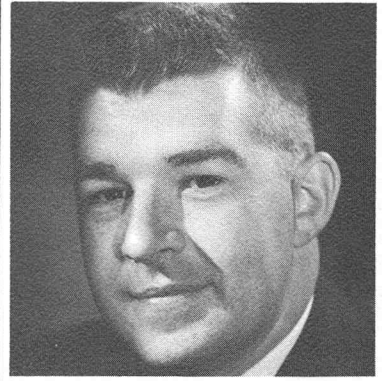

Final Flu Shot Set for December 7

To insure maximum protection against influenza, employees who received the first injection should also receive the second. Those who did not receive the first shot on October 12 may get one December 7. Although flu-shot procedures will be the same as those followed in October, Lois Addington, R.N. (Health Services) provided these reminders:

1. A 50-cent payroll (IBM) deduction will be made for each injection.
2. Only employees (no dependents) may receive shots.
3. IBM cards will be sent to each department December 6. Supervisors will distribute them December 7.
4. Employees must bring the IBM card with them when they receive the shot. Those who do not want the vaccine may destroy the card.
5. Anyone with cold or flu symptoms should not be vaccinated.
6. Those with severe allergies (especially egg or chicken) should check with their physician before taking vaccine.
7. Swing shift personnel will receive their shots in building 45.
8. Graveyard shift employees may come in for shots at 7 a.m. or at any time or any location during the day.
9. Outlying areas and groups who have not been contacted by Health Services may receive their shots at a time and location convenient to them.
10. No make-up shots will be offered.
11. Minors (single, under 21) must have written permission from their parent or legal guardian to receive the vaccine. Forms may be obtained from the First Aid offices. Take the signed form with you when you go for vaccine.
12. All questions regarding flu shots will be answered by Lois Addington, ext. 7433.

The second polyvalent influenza vaccine injection will be administered at the following times and locations:

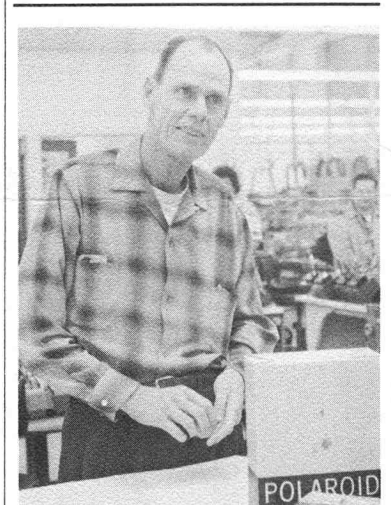

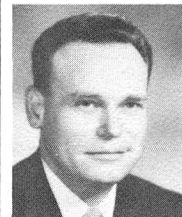

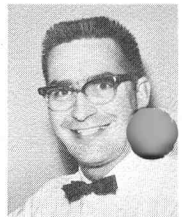
