Operation of the Central Job Evaluation committee was suspended last week by Bob Fitzgerald, domestic general manager. The CJEC has completed its most recent assignment: Recommending benchmark jobs in the

upper pay ranges, which have been reviewed and accepted by operating managers. The committee has been active in setting benchmarks for the company and developing descriptions to aid in job evaluation.

Fitz thanked the group "for a very fine job—not only for the recent assignment, but for the total job that has been done in the last several months."

The CJEC will be called into session for any special problems which arise. Area JEC's now will rank all remaining jobs and identify problem areas.
