## Legislators' Research Day Brings Visitors to Tek

A group of Oregon legislators toured Tektronix Friday as part of the "Legislators' Research Day," sponsored by eight Oregon Chambers of Commerce. The solons' day ended with an evening dinner in Salem, hosted by the sponsoring Chambers.

"The tour attempted to get the legislators acquainted with the new technologically oriented in-

dustries and research facilities," explained Jack Day (Central Staff Services), chairman of the Beaverton C. of C. Education committee. "One section of legislators toured the southern Willamette facilities around Eugene and Corvallis; the other section visited Tektronix as part of a tour of northern Willamette sites."

The legislators, accompanied by Chamber representatives, were met at Martin Marietta in Sunset by Tom Williams (Plant Supporting Services), tour chairman. They traveled by bus through Tektronix Industrial Park, then disembarked and split up into three groups to tour the CRT, Ceramics and Metals buildings. Each group's tour ended in an Assembly building visit.

Tektronix managers, including President Howard Vollum, joined legislators and Chamber representatives for lunch in Building 45 cafeteria. Following this, the participants in the "Legislators' Research Day" group left to continue their day's tour of the northern Willamette research laboratories, university research facilities and science-oriented industries.

The evening dinner at Illahe Hills country club in Salem, concluding the day's activities, featured guest speaker Dr. Jesse E. Hobson, Dallas, Texas, research consultant.
