## Price Adjustment On Tek Food Effective Monday, August 6

Continuing the policy of pricing food items to "break even," the Food Services department announced that food prices will increase on some items beginning Monday, August 6. The food prices are adjusted to cover the cost of food and labor, not including the cost of providing free coffee. No attempt is made to make a profit.

The practice of pricing items to the nearest nickel will be discontinued, since check out stands are operated during the rush hour at most locations. This is done to shorten the waiting lines, to help employees figure meal prices, and to make change.

These changes result in decreasing the prices on 41 items, leaving 54 items the same price, and increasing the prices on 166 items.

The last general price adjustment on Tek food was in September 1959.

## Tektronix Nine Tie In TVL First Half

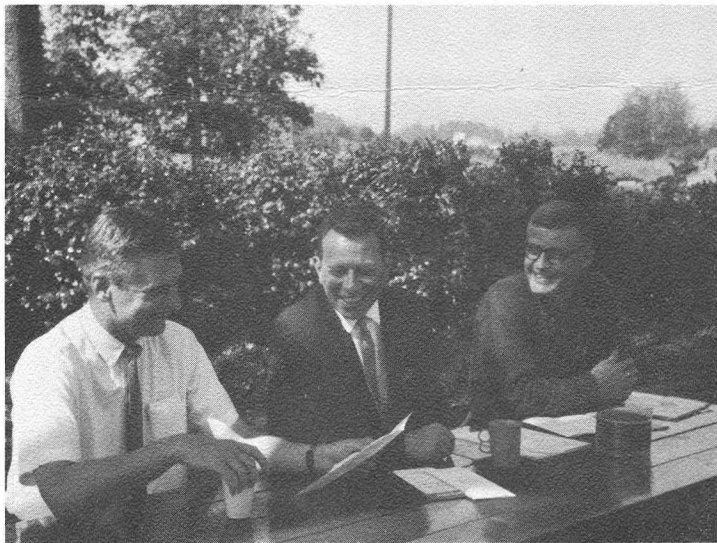

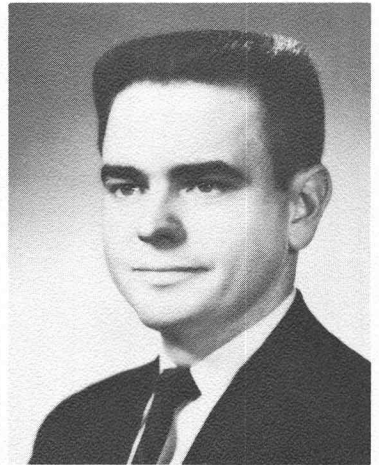
## Tek Office Girls To Dine At Ho-Ti Supper Club

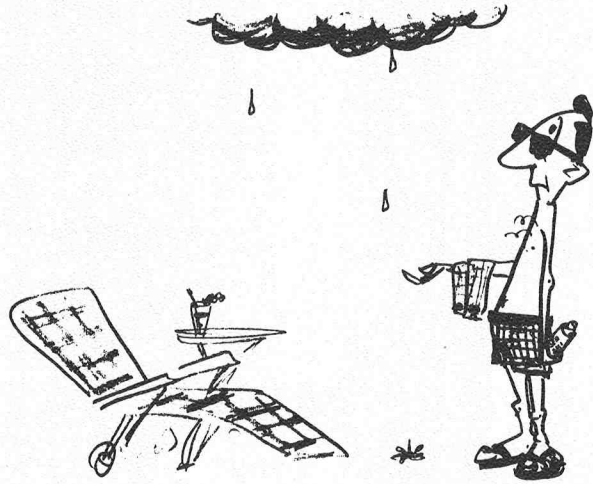
