## County High School Seniors Apply For '63 Foundation Scholarships

Applications are now being received for the 1963 Tektronix Foundation scholarships, which are awarded annually to Washington county high school seniors.

Any senior attending a high school in Washington county and who plans on entering an accredited college in the United States the fall term immediately following graduation, and who will major in a physical science or mathematics is eligible.

The selection committee, composed of community leaders and interested Tektronix personnel, awards the scholarships on the basis of: Type of courses taken; grades received; recommendations of teachers and counselors; aptitude and results of College Entrance Examination Board scholastic aptitude test (SAT). If the CEEB achievement test has been taken, those results are also considered.

The scholarships are awarded

solely on the basis of merit, but the actual amount of the stipend is determined by the student's need. Funds range from a minimum of \$250 to a maximum of \$1000.

Students who qualify and are interested in the scholarship program should obtain application forms from their school principals promptly, as the deadline for application is April 1, according to Tom Williams, Plant Supporting Services manager.

## Tek Foundation Trustees Establish Stanford University Fellowship

At a recent meeting of the Tektronix Foundation trustees, the decision was made to establish a \$5000 Tektronix Foundation fellowship at Stanford university. According to Dean J. M. Pettit, recipients of the fellowship will primarily be first-year graduate students working in the field of solid-state electronics in the Department of Electrical Engineering.

The grant includes tuition and subsidy for the student. A portion will be used for additional expenses in the department. Stanford will endeavor to award the fellowship to outstanding students

The following Call Report information was sent in by Field Engineer Bill Pyle of the Union, N.J., field office after he had visited Tek customer, Bell Telephone Laboratories, Inc. at Murray Hill, N.J.:

TELSTAR ASSIST: I was informed that the ability to establish Telstar communication again was mainly attributed to the Tektronix 160 series. In attempting to isolate the false pulses which had inadvertently "shut off" Telstar, they found that the only delay generator which afforded reproducible signals was the 160 series. It was a signal from the 160 series which turned Telstar back on. It was also mentioned that the people engaged in this work are more impressed with the 160 series than any other instrumentation they are using.

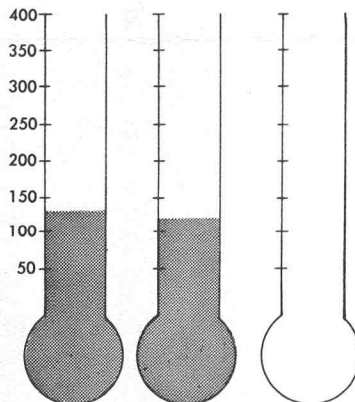
