## Future World Leaders Train In Summer Work Program

"I think it is very important for the free world to exchange students who will be the leaders in their countries within the the next 10 or 15 years, so there will be in this way better understanding between the countries. Such a program gives them opportunities to learn about, and to appreciate, each other's problems and way of living."

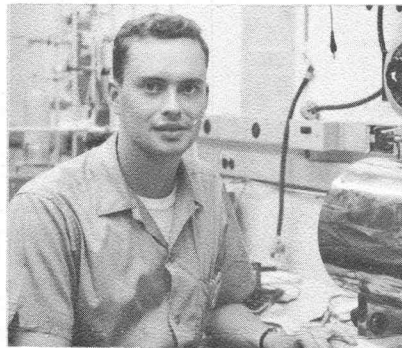
With this comment Henk van Eupen summarized his feelings about his opportunity to come to the U.S. and to work at Tektronix. A student at Tilburg Economic university in Tilburg, The Netherlands, Henk came to the U.S. under an exchange work program sponsored by the International Association of Students in Economics and Business (A.I.E.S.E.C.). After nine weeks in Company Planning, he will return to Tilburg to complete a graduate degree in economics and business.

This summer about 240 college students, or prospective college students, representing 35 colleges and universities, are employed at Tektronix. They are working in nearly every department, performing tasks ranging from simple clerical functions to highly technical research or laboratory operations.

Some of them are working at Tek for the first time. Others, such as David Coffey, come back year after year to gain experience in many different areas of the company. Dave came to Tek during the summer of 1959, and worked in Coils. He spent the summer

of 1960 in Transformers, and worked last summer as a technician in Domestic Operations Quality Assurance. This summer Dave is working in Research with Jim Donoghue. He graduated from Reed college in 1961 and is presently doing graduate work in physics at Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn. After obtaining his Ph.D. in physics Dave expects to spend his time in applied research.

The summer employment program, administered by Bob Martyn (Employment), benefits both the student and Tektronix. The primary aim of the program is two-fold: To provide vacation manpower relief and to assist in Tek's long-range recruiting plans. Processing of applications begins early in the spring; by the time spring vacations are over, most of the college students have completed their interviews and been accepted for summer work.

The summer work program gives students and Tek a chance to know each other. Sometimes this is just good public relations. In other cases, it results in students coming to work permanently at Tek after graduation from college. For instance, Brad Franklin (I.M. Planning) worked at Tektronix six consecutive summers, beginning in 1956. After completing undergraduate work in industrial and labor relations at Cornell university, he went on to the University of Pennsylvania where, in May of this year, he received his master's degree in business administration from the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce.

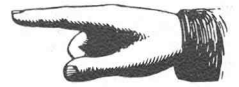
